UCC School of Business Wins the 2021 Tertiary Business Sense Challenge

The University of Cape Coast (UCC) School of Business has been declared winner of the third edition of the Tertiary Business Sense Challenge (TBSC). UCC School of Business battled the Kwame Nkrumah University of Science and Technology for the trophy on 28th August, 2021. UCC clinched the title in the maiden edition in 2019 but lost the second edition to the University for Development Studies.



The third version of the competition kicked off to a fortunate start for UCC as the opponents (Bolgatanga Technical University) was a no show and, as such, the UCC team got a walkover to the second stage of the competition.

The UCC team then battled Accra Technical University at the second stage of the competition and trod over Tamale Technical University with a *whooping* 60-point gap in the quarter finals.

Team UCC had the toughest challenge, yet, when it faced the University of Education, Winneba in the semi-final contest. It was a *battle of nerves and wills* which saw UCC emerging victorious, with a 20-point difference and securing a place in the finals for the third time in three years.

The finals took place at TV3 studio B on 28th August, 2021 with

he School of Business of the University of Cape Coast (UCC), has presented educational books and certificates to 186 high-performing students with a CGPA of 3.6 and above during its 2021 Dean's Award Ceremony. The ceremony was held on 25th March, 2021 at Auditorium 900, C. A. Ackah Lecture Theatre Complex, North Campus of the University. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, physical attendance was limited to awardees, faculty, administrative staff and few invited guests while students and the general public joined virtually.





The chairman for the occasion, Prof. Francis Eric Amuquandoh, Provost of the College of Humanities and Legal Studies, indicated that learning was a difficult task, therefore, students who had excelled academically, especially, during the COVID-19 pandemic deserved to be celebrated. He congratulated the students and encouraged them to continue to work hard to maintain or improve their current CGPA.

CESED Trains Agricultural Entrepreneurs

The Centre for Entrepreneurship and Small Enterprise Development (CESED) in May and June 2021 organised entrepreneurial training for 35 farmers in the Kakum Catchment Area, specifically Nyamebekyere, Bobi, Paaso and Sum Nyame Kodur, in the Central Region of Ghana. The training is situated within the broader scope of equipping the farmers with sustainable alternative livelihoods as part of the Family Life (SOW 2) joint project of the Rainforest Alliance, Olam and Läderach (Schweiz) AG.

This year's training is the fourth in a series conducted by CESED for the Rainforest Alliance, an international non-governmental organisation. The training sessions focused on developing the entrepreneurial mindset of the farmers and equipping them with creativity, opportunity identification, book-keeping, financial management, branding, marketing and business plan writing skills. Since 2017, a total of 115 farmers who are into grasscutter farming,







vegetable farming, trading, bakery and beekeeping have received entrepreneurial training, coaching and backstopping support from CESED. The training has yielded positive results. A typical example is the success story of Mr. Damoah, a grasscutter farmer, who started with 4 female and 2 male grasscutters. Since 2016, he had been able to grow his flock to 167 out of which he had sold 145 at an average price of GHC150.



He further noted that students and alumni of the school were contributing and influencing governance, policymaking, entrepreneurship and innovation in Ghana and beyond. "Our lecturers, administrative staff, and students are always motivated by our core values reliability, integrity, governance, honesty and teamwork," he said.



The guest speaker for the event was Mr. Alhassan Trawule, Head of Research Unit at the Institute of Chartered Accountants Ghana (ICAG). He spoke on the theme "How to Achieve and Sustain Academic Excellence Pandemic". In sharing his personal experiences as a first-class student of the UCC School of Business, he explained that there was the need to always see the award ceremony as a motivator. He said that academic excellence has been identified with achieving high grades and superior performance, but it is more than just making good grades. Besides academic excellence, Mr. Trawule exhorted students to develop their

UCC Lecturer Wins Journal of African Business 2020 Best Paper Award

Second Best Paper Award from the Journal of African Business. The award winning paper titled "Using Theory of Planned Behaviour in

Marketing to Predict Waste Disposal Behaviour in Ghana" had previously won the best conference paper award at the 19th International Academy of African Business and Development (IAABD) Conference in Durban, South Africa (16th to 19th May, 2018).

In relation to the award, Hon. Dr. Nyarku shared this with the Business News: "In the paper, we employed a quantitative approach to examine how a behavioural change theory (theory of planned behaviour [TPB]) could be used in social marketing to predict households' waste disposal behaviour in Ghana." Findings of the study showed that attitude towards waste disposal behaviour was the strongest predictor of behaviour, followed by subjective norm and then intention.

The findings will help social marketing implementers and policy-makers to develop effective waste disposal interventions programmes using variables that are applicable in our context. The study, in its uniqueness, appears to be the first to systematically and quantitatively apply the Theory of Planned Behaviour in social marketing to investigate waste disposal behaviour in an emerging economy context. Hon. Dr. Nyarku recommended that policy makers or the government should introduce policies that will help reduce the barriers in the environmental setting which prevent households to properly dispose of their waste. For instance, they can provide accessible waste bins, and inexpensive waste collection fee to help remove the barriers to proper waste disposal adoption.

Why Drink Enough Water

hear that water is life. In water is essential for your health.

But why? Water is your body's principal chemical component as it makes up about 50% to 70% of

your body weight. It is, therefore, obvious that your body depends on water to survive. Every cell, tissue and organ in your body needs water to work properly. The following are some benefits of water:

- 1. It regulates your body temperature. Your body loses water through sweat during physical activity and in hot environments like ours. Your sweat keeps your body cool. Therefore, staying hydrated is crucial to maintaining your body temperature. If you sweat more than usual, make sure you drink enough water to avoid dehydration.
- 2. Water protects your tissues, spinal cord and joints. Water helps to lubricate and cushion your joints, spinal cord and tissues. This will help you enjoy physical activity and lessen discomfort caused by conditions like arthritis.
- 3. Water helps to excrete harmful waste products. The body excretes waste products through sweat, urine and stools. Your body uses water to produce sweat and urine, and have bowel movements. Water is, therefore, needed in enough quantities to replenish the lost fluid in sweat, to have healthy stools and avoid constipation. Water also assists the kidneys to work efficiently in the production of urine.
- 4. Water helps the body fight off diseases. Drinking enough water can help prevent certain medical conditions like kidney stones, urinary tract infections and exercise-induced asthma. Water also helps the body absorb important vitamins, minerals and nutrients from the food you eat.
- 5. Water is also known to boost energy, aid in cognitive functions and keeps your skin bright.

How much water should you drink?

About 20% of your daily fluid intake usually comes from food and the rest from drinks. The United States National Academies of Sciences, Engineering, and Medicine determined that an adequate daily fluid intake is about 15.5 cups (3.7 litres, approximately 7 sachets of water) of fluids a day for men, and about 11.5 cups (2.7 litres, approximately 5 sachets of water) of fluids a day for women. These recommendations cover fluids from food, beverages and water.

How to tell if you are dehydrated

Feeling thirsty indicates your body is not receiving adequate hydration. If your urine is dark or coloured, you may be dehydrated. Pale or non-coloured urine typically indicates proper hydration.

Water is certainly essential to life. Endeavour to drink enough water every day for optimal health!


